- •____It should not be cluttered with too much (KISS keep it simple, senor or senorita).
- ____It should highlight the three main points of your speech.
- __It should have a graphic or picture that catches the eye, supports your topic, and is easy to see from a distance.





Gifted Education Public Speaking Curriculum Rules Grade 4: Expository

Purpose: to inform & expose a topic, but do not give an opinion or take a position

1. No costumes or implied by clothing (example: shirt with related logo or topic)
2. 3-5 minutes in length
3. notecards may be used (as a reference), but majority should be memorized
4. visual aid(s) needed that support speech
5. quotations must be cited (tell where quote came from)
6. can paraphrase quotations (put them in own words and explain
7. typed copy may be requested
